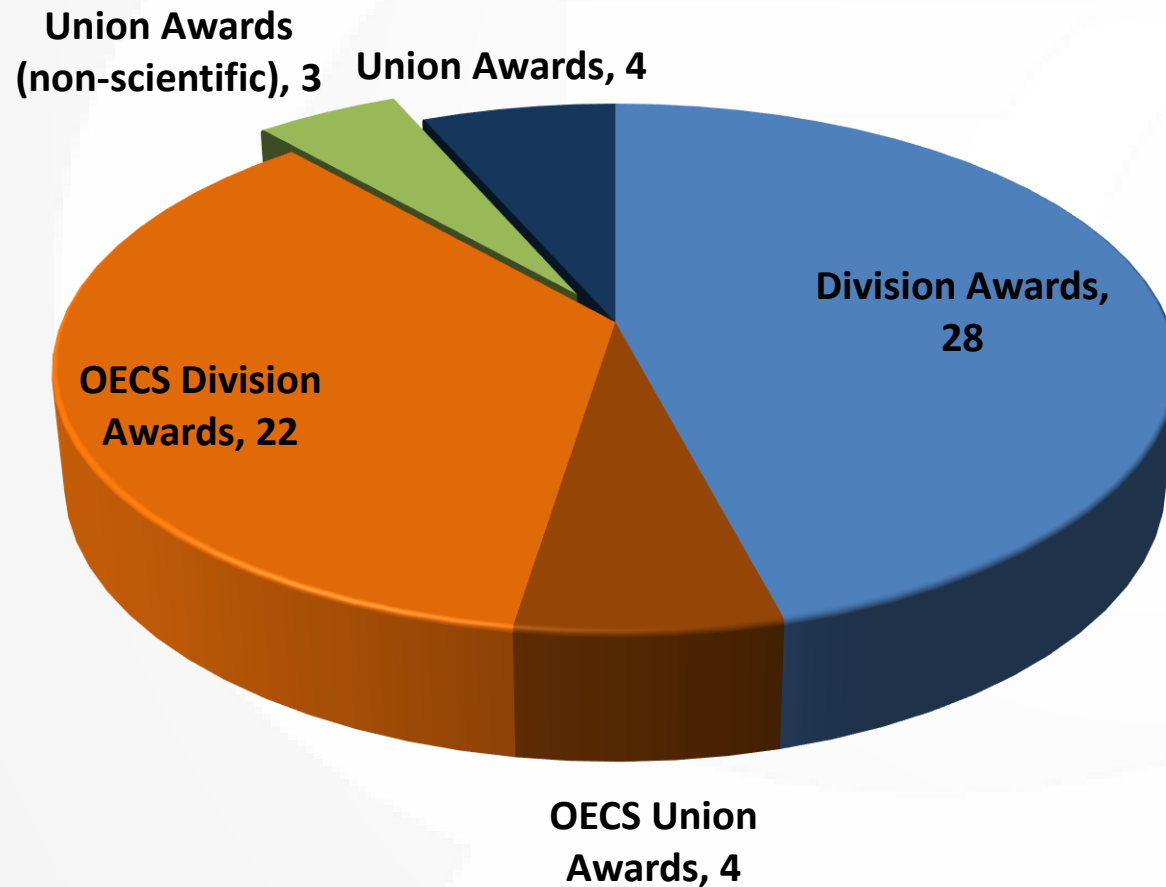

How to become an awardee?

- » **Nominations are exclusively by EGU members (no self nomination)***

- » Individual award and medal committees are then evaluating the nominations selecting the most deserving candidate based on **scientific achievements****.

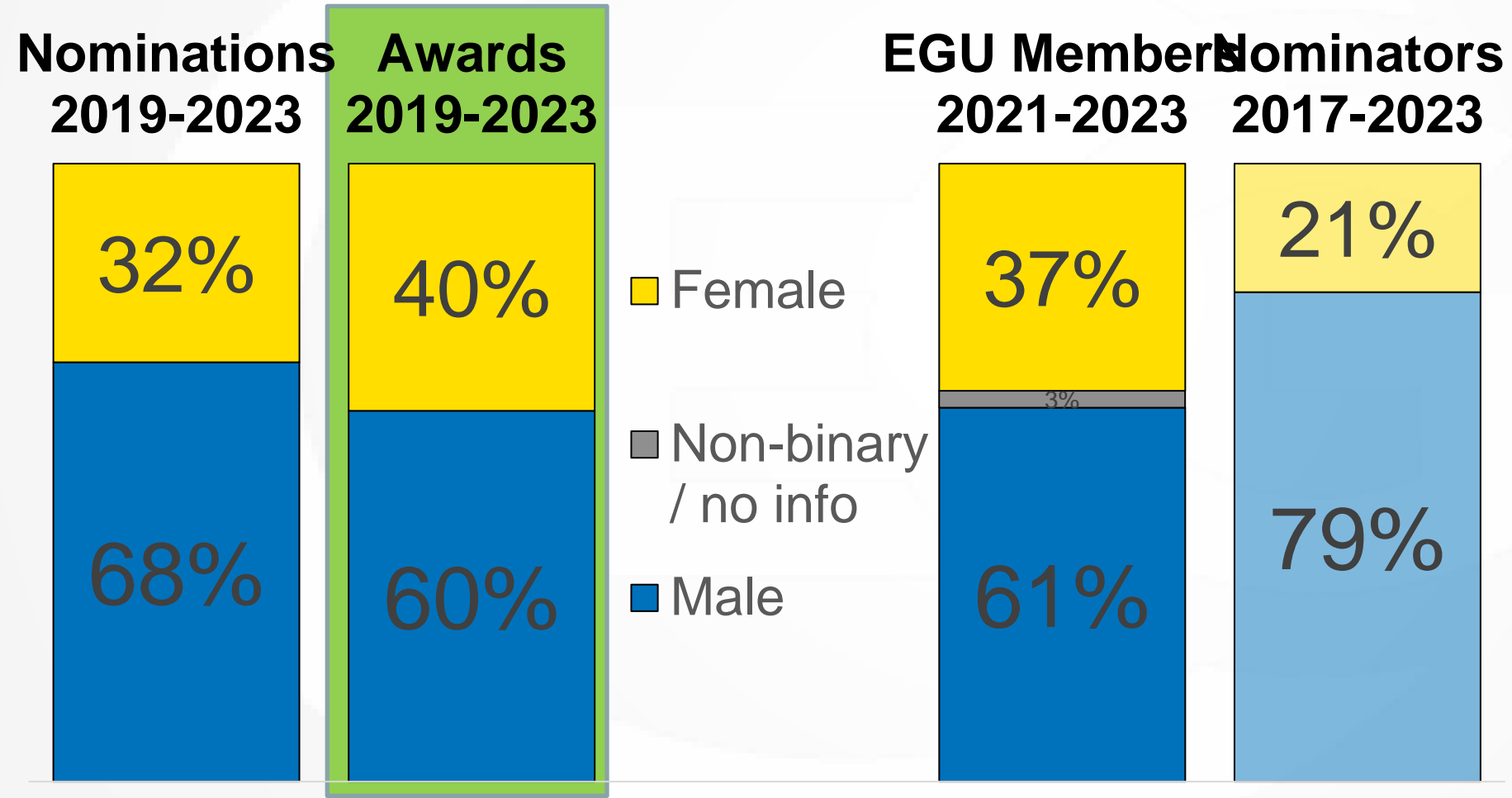
* An exception is one award to promote excellence in journalism allowing nominations from non-members and self nominations

Early Career Scientist

- » An Early Career Scientist (ECS) is a student, a PhD candidate, or a practicing scientist who received their highest certificate (e.g. BSc, MSc or PhD) within the past seven years. The seven-year period can be extended to allow for periods when the scientist was not working in science because of, but not limited to, caring and/or parental responsibilities, disability, personal illness, community obligations or national service.
- » For the purpose of the awards the nominee should satisfy one of the above criteria by 1 January of the year when the award is presented.

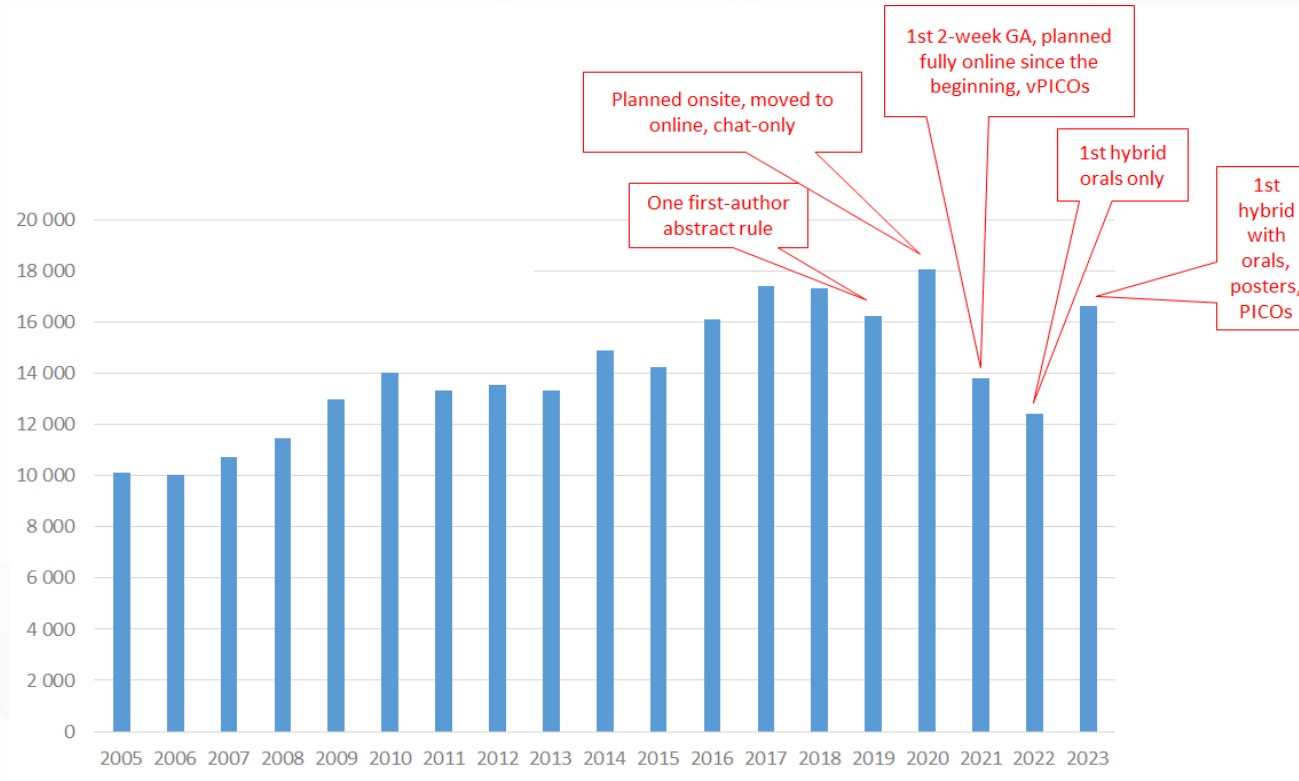

EGU23 Registration Statistics (as of 17 Apr)

- 16,604 **active scheduled abstracts**
- 15,319 **total registrations** (13,287 on-site / 2,032 virtual) 17,234 (as of 23 Apr)
- ~13% of total participants registered for **virtual participation** 14,644 on-site / 2,590 virtual (15%)
- ~ 40% of total participants are **PhD candidates, Master or Undergraduate students** (~ 25% participating virtually)
- ~ 5% of registered participants from **low- & lower-middle income countries** (approx. equally distributed onsite & virtual participation)
- **Gender:** male (~ 57 %) and female (~ 39 %), with less difference between percentages for virtual participation

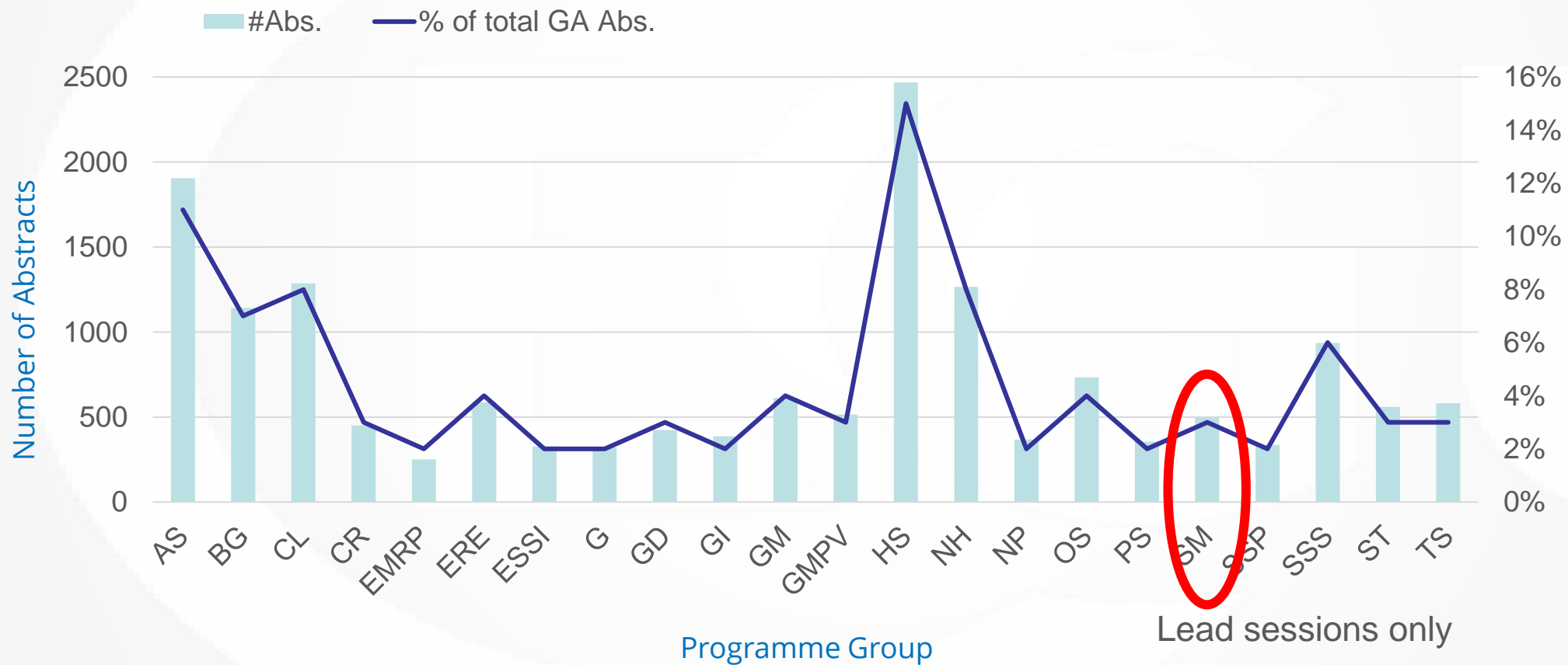
